INCOME ORANGEAID'S MISSION



Established in 2010, Income OrangeAid empowers youth-in-need in Singapore through education. Income donates 1% of its annual insurance operating profits to support OrangeAid programmes. To date, Income OrangeAid has disbursed more than \$12 million to over 9,000 children and youths through strategic community partnerships and programmes.




The FDP supports low-income students studying at the Institute of Technical Education (ITE) and polytechnics with bursaries, financial literacy training, as well as, personal and career guidance. With a focus on social mobility, the programme was designed to offer students from disadvantaged backgrounds some reprieve from their financial challenges so that they can stay more focused in completing their tertiary education.






Beneficiaries have more time to focus on school work

THE FDP ALUMNI PROGRAMME EQUIPPED BENEFICIARIES TO BE FUTURE-READY



The Alumni programme aims to help beneficiaries become more future-ready by introducing them to alternative career choices and skill-sets that they require to transition into the work force.

The Alumni programme comprises a coaching and facilitator training programme. The coaching initiative complements career mentoring programmes at Institutes of Higher Learning and aims to broaden the beneficiaries' horizons about alternative career choices. Last year, Janson Choo, Creative Director at BBH Singapore, and Pamela Chng, Founder of Social Enterprise, Bettr Barista, coached Alumni beneficiaries on creative advertising and social business respectively.

In 2019, the facilitator training programme, inspired by feedback from FDP beneficiaries who expressed a desire to give back to the FDP as they had benefited from the programme, groomed 32 students to be assistant facilitators at the character development and financial literacy training workshops for their peers. These trainees who were also interested in pursuing a career in training, picked up skills and knowledge in effective listening, small-group communication and leadership style.

"As a facilitator, I have learnt to communicate clearly and gained confidence. These are important qualities to have in the workforce. The facilitator training programme has allowed me to understand that everyone has a different story, experience and set of beliefs. As I contribute to the FDP, which I believe to be a strong support system for youths-in-need, I have also gained new perspectives on life, developing a career and financial planning"

INCOME FAMILY MICRO-INSURANCE AND SAVINGS SCHEME (IFMISS) PROTECTS 29,000 LOW-INCOME INDIVIDUALS



IFMISS offers insurance protection, at no premium, to low-income families with young children studying at NTUC First Campus' My First Skool and primary schools, who come under the Ministry of Education Financial Assistance Scheme. IFMISS offers a maximum pay-out of \$10,000 in the unfortunate event that the parent/guardian of the eligible child passes away or suffers total and permanent

disability. In 2019, IFMISS disbursed close to \$210,000 in claims.

ENHANCED RESILIENCE AND VALUES AMONGST AT-RISK YOUTHS IN SPECIALISED SCHOOL



OrangeAid supported values-in-action programmes at the Assumption Pathway School (APS) through the APS Challenge. The programmes benefitted over 900 students by providing them with knowledge and skills to explore new interests, enhance their resilience and cope better with their own adversities.
