

IN BURSARIES TO 400 UNDERPRIVILEGED YOUTHS THROUGH THE INCOME ORANGEAID FUTURE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

The Income OrangeAid Future Development Programme (FDP) continues to be the company's flagship community initiative, championing education for youth-in-need. The FDP supports low-income students studying at the Institute of Technical Education (ITE) and polytechnics with bursaries, financial literacy training, as well as, personal and career guidance. With a focus on social mobility, the programme was designed to offer students from disadvantaged backgrounds some reprieve from their financial challenges so that they can stay more focused in completing their tertiary education.

Due to safe distancing measures that resulted from the pandemic last year, the FDP financial literacy workshops were moved online, leveraging an interactive education digital application.





The online workshops saw a 100% participation rate amongst FDP beneficiaries

INCOME FAMILY MICRO-INSURANCE SCHEME EXPANDED TO COVER STUDENTS FROM SECONDARY SCHOOLS, SPECIALISED SCHOOLS AND PRE-UNIVERSITY INSTITUTIONS

The Income Family Micro-Insurance Scheme (IFMIS) offers children and youths from low-income families insurance protection in the event of a loss of a parent or guardian, or if they suffered permanent disability. IFMIS offers a pay-out of \$5,000 in the unfortunate event that the insured passes away or suffers total and permanent disability.

During the year, we expanded the scheme to include 22,000 more eligible students studying in local secondary schools, specialised schools and pre-university institutions who are also Ministry of Education Financial Assistance Scheme (MOE FAS) recipients. This is in addition to eligible students from primary schools and NTUC First Campus' My First Skool.

CONTRIBUTION TO SAMH IN SUPPORT

OF MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS



The annual Income Eco Run served the dual purpose of a family day for our staff and their family members to show support for zero waste, as well as, a fund-raising event to highlight mental health issues which came under the spotlight as a result of the pandemic. Funds raised went towards supporting creative therapeutic interventions by the Singapore Association for Mental Health (SAMH) for youths facing stress and anxiety, especially during this difficult pandemic period.

A total of 700 staff together with their families walked 5,884km to raise \$60,000 for SAMH
